Premier Grade

Well the season is finally underway after a productive pre season that started in February. All players in the senior group have worked hard in this period to get us to the necessary level of fitness and conditioning. We are fortunate to have an expanded coaching group this season who bring an additional balance of skills and experience to the mix that can only benefit all players. The efforts of Ben Piggot the Conditioning coach have been well received by the players in terms of the variety and dynamic conditioning they have experienced. It is amazing how many ways there are to stretch your self physically. In addition Mike Brain's forward knowledge and defensive enthusiasm have also come to the fore and we look forward to seeing this demonstrated by the team on the field.

We are running the gold squad of players who will push for selection each week in Premiers and Reserve grade. Reserve Grade

Training sessions have been well attended and last week the Gold squad was chosen after a weekend of trial matches. We were really looking forward to our first real test against Cott.

The game started off with both sides trying to find their feet, as it was the first game of the season. Soaks did dominate for large parts of the game but we need to improve in many basic areas of control, such as the ruck & maul, line outs, tackling and basic ball through the hands. The side is a new look team compared to last year, and there are many combinations and key roll positions that are still not resolved and this was noticeable in the game. Even though we often didn't get the ball going forward we were still able to run the ball along the backline with good effect, but then didn't take advantage of several scoring opportunities.

The pack played well in patches and it was great to see Massie back on the field and showed that when his fitness is back he will have a big impact. At times the lineout worked very well, but there is still enormous room for improvement. The back row of Luke, Corey and Ruser tried hard all day and showed with a bit more work, they will give us control of the loose ball. The back line showed glimpses of what they could do but need to play to their strengths which are out wide and use their pace. Rob Barugh demonstrated once again why he is such a highly rated halfback, while Bucket showed us that by giving him a little width he can score tries. Matt, a new member to the club at full back, showed great pace and when he joined the line provided a dangerous weapon by scoring a good try from 30m out. Our defence lacked at times but Binnsy showed what can be achieved if you apply yourself. We had many chances to score but did not capitalize when the opportunity was presented. That can be expected early in the season and with some hard work in key areas we will eliminate these errors. At 15 -14 with two minutes to go we gave away a penalty to loose the match 17-15.

Tristan Winnall, one of the young guns who stepped up to the mark on Saturday in the Gold team's win over Perth.

After a blistering performance in the second half in which he scored a try and took the ball forward on many occasions, the former state schoolboy clinched the man of the match from centre **Nev Halberg**. The 18-year-old hard running back rower Winnall shows all the attributes of becoming a key pillar to the future success of the Gold team.

Speaking this week about the team's second round victory over Perth and his man of the match performance Tristan said. "I couldn't imagine playing anywhere else but with Soaks. The players are tight bunch and it's a great environment in which to play rugby. The advantage of playing in such a strong club is the guidance and experience I've gained by training and playing alongside top players." Tristan said that Associates was the best place in Perth for him to develop as a player.

Playing into the strong wind during the first half Gold had only crossed the Perth line once with a well executed move in which flyhalf **Michael Rovira** made a line break and passed off to winger **Gene Brutty**.

Poor execution of simple skills proved to be very expensive in the first half where we continually let ourselves down with poor tackling and passing. Despite crossing the line without being challenged, in what was our only opportunity to score the ball was dropped. This was just one more example of the first half lack of urgency and concentration.

Down at half time 3 -0 the team needed a little extra for the second stanza. With a more feverish approach the second half saw the Gold team put on 3 tries through **Josh McDonald**, **Tristan Winnall** and **John Clohessey**. The surprise of the day came from flanker **Phil Stroud** who kicked three from three conversions to give the team a good 21 – 3 win

Phil is a good sized young man who has tremendous speed and power, which are all standout features of the good players in the competition. He is one of the better athletes in the team but still has a lot to learn in the game. This is his first season of full-time training and over the next two seasons he will certainly improve and develop both physically and as a player. Finding that Phil can kick goals confirms what I have been thinking that despite his physical size which automatically classes him as a forward has the speed and skill to make a good back .

Prop **Everett Ngu** is learning the game but already he's shown that he's a good listener and his performance in the front row was much improved form the previous week. After struggling with the opposition tighthead the previous week he and fellow prop **Malcolm Ferguson** were much lower and had better body positions making a better platform for the locks. **Everett** has backed up his scrummaging with some impressive running and tackling in the loose, continuing his progression as one of the team's best front-row prospects.

Having two locks who are both capable back row forwards has improved the mobility of the team. **Peter Trend** and **John Clohessey**, both second year players showed their proven experience and talent cutting off opposition incursions and turning the game around in our favour through penetrating runs.

JUNIORS

Hi everyone, and welcome to a new season of Junior Rugby down at Soaks. This year promises to be an exciting one in the lead up to the Western Force kicking off in 2006.

A huge thank you to all of our Committee members and volunteers who have got us through the crucial registration period. A good effort considering most committee members also work full time and are also coming straight from work like most parents. A special thanks to all those that registered on Feb 19th, half of our regos were taken on that day alone.

Social membership has blossomed beautifully this season and it is great to see so many parents becoming social members.

As you may well have noticed, the building works have started. The 1st phase has made viewing and socialising more comfortable and user friendly for those taking up the opportunity.

2005 season sees SOAKS fielding 17 sides from U7's to U17's with approx 270 registered players. We have had a notable increase in the U12's this year, providing 3 full squads; on the downside, we were unable to field an U16 team. That will be the goal for next year.

In 2004 SOAKS won The Club Championship and this will be our priority again this year. The Club Championship is based on the accumulation of Championship points from all the junior teams as well as all Senior grades, a combined effort in which everyone plays their part. This makes for a well balanced club. ***A Championship Club!***

The grading of junior teams into A and B sides, as opposed to green and gold, has been mentioned on occasion. In short, we don't grade our juniors. It is written policy and is available for viewing to anyone. There are clubs that do grade their juniors, they call their A side a development squad; they don't say what they call their second team.

My feeling is that these clubs are building glasshouses as opposed to building a good solid structure within their respective Clubs. By having a good club structure Associates Juniors have been able to rise through to the senior ranks consistently over the years, providing more junior players into the 1st grade than any other club. SOAKS colts sides have dominated the competition for the last 10 years and we have also consistently provided a high number of State Representatives from junior level to Perth Gold in the Seniors. I believe our structure is working well for us.

Over the past couple of years the WAJRU have implemented a bonus point system for the U15's to U 17's based on behaviour and not performance. Things like player, coaches, spectator and referee abuse will result in no bonus points being awarded, as will any foul play. It has been so successful that this year the U13's and U14's will also be included. The referee will fill out a report card after each game. I'm pleased to say SOAKS has a good record to date and I'm sure everyone will do their bit to keep it that way.

I would like to encourage at least **one** parent from every team to do a touch judges course. This takes approx 2¹/₂ hours to do on one designated evening. Being an accredited touch judge lets you assist the referee with foul play, spectator abuse etc.... It's very effective for keeping everyone focused on the game. Please let Jeremy Warren (Coaching Co-ordinator) or myself know ASAP if you are interested.

As a Club we DO NOT encourage parents to drop off their children on training nights and disappear for an hour or so. Whilst at times this may be necessary, a guardian MUST BE appointed and managers or coaches notified in case of an emergency.

In a club of our size it's inevitable that differences of opinion may arise and I would like to encourage anyone with any queries to approach myself or Jeremy Warren sooner rather than later.

Finally, enjoy **your** Club and be an active participant within our Rugby Structure.

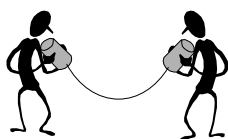
